The Ukrainian Canadian Students' Union (SUSK) and the Ukrainian Canadian Professional and Business Association (UCPBA) of Toronto co-hosted the first Networking Event for Students and Recent Graduates on Thursday, November 21, 2013. With the enthusiastic support of Paul Strathdee and his board, the venue was sponsored by St. Vladimir Institute in Toronto. It brought together nearly sixty youth to connect and mingle with about twenty professionals and entrepreneurs.

The event began with a reception for attendees and was followed by "speed networking" sessions, where students participated in three 20-minute sessions to speak with professionals and entrepreneurs about their career ambitions, the school-to-workplace transition, as well as other meaningful life experiences.
